

A Distillery and Orchards.

The subscriber will sell the fruit coming to maturity this season at Perry Hall, twelve miles from the city of Baltimore on three thousand Apple, & nine hundred Peach trees, together with the use of the following conveniences, viz. a DISTILLERY, with two stills, an excellent Screw Cider Press, at which twelve hogsheads of cider per day have been made, a tenement to live in, stable and room for storage of liquor. The trees have, at the least, as much fruit on them as will keep one team steadily employed in collecting, grinding and taking it to market. There are few places probably in the United States where more or better fruit is collected than at Perry Hall, the late Mr. Gough having, for many years been at considerable expence and uncommon pains to encrease and improve it, persons wishing to examine the trees &c. will apply to Mr. Dimmitt, the manager, on the place.
